


Non-emergency Calls (101 Calls) - (1st October 2023 - 30th September 2024)







Our policing response




The national standards for response times are: Immediate Urban – 15mins / Immediate Rural – 20mins / Priority – 60mins.







Burglary - Residential













By Occurrence Type









Count by Age Group






